

HBCU TRAVEL RULES AND POLICIES

Welcome to St. Anthony's First Historically Black College and University Tour. This event will be an annual event taking place in April during the Easter Recess each year.

This Years Dates are Monday April 5th - 7th 2021

Visiting 5 schools in 3 days

Morgan State, Coppin State, Howard University, University of the District of Columbia, and Hampton University

Trip total \$600.00

Historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs) are institutions of [higher education in the United States](#) that were established before the [Civil Rights Act of 1964](#) with the intention of primarily serving the [African-American](#) community. Most of these institutions were founded in the years after the [American Civil War](#) and are concentrated in the [Southern United States](#). During the period of [segregation](#) in the United States prior to the Civil Rights Act, the overwhelming majority of higher education institutions were predominantly white and completely disqualified or limited African-American enrollment. For a century after the end of slavery in the United States in 1865, most colleges and universities in the [Southern United States](#) prohibited all African Americans from attending, while institutions in other parts of the country regularly employed quotas to limit admissions of blacks.

There are 101 HBCUs in the United States, including both public and private institutions (down from the 121 institutions that existed during the 1930s). Of these remaining HBCU institutions in the United States, 27 offer doctoral programs, 52 offer master's programs, 83 offer bachelor's degree programs, and 38 offer associate degrees

This trip is designed to expose our St. Anthony Community to additional collegiate opportunities and show off the wealth these Historically Black College and Universities schools possess academically and athletically.

In this inaugural year our numbers are limited to 44 travelers. Priority will be given by grade starting with the class of 2022 on a first come basis and then sophomores and freshmen will be considered. As the numbers grow each year we will include

additional transportation allowing for a larger student body to experience these schools. We encourage students to register early in order to be included.

The cost will be \$600.00 including - Transportation, hotel stay, breakfast, lunch and travel apparel. Each student attending must fill out all forms, attend all meetings and sign the travel agreement.

There will be three chaperons and more as needed. An initial deposit is required to be considered. Final payments can be divided or one lump sum can be paid.

PRINCIPLES AND RULES

1. Breakfast and Lunch are included in the cost of the package. Students should plan on additional funds for dinner and snacks.
2. Students are limited to one carry on size piece of luggage and a backpack. All Luggage should have a name tag visible at all times.
3. All bags will be inspected before departure at 5:30am in the student Center. Parent/Guardian must be present at time of inspection.
4. NO ALCOHOL, NO DRUGS, NO SMOKING - on the trip anywhere, anytime.
5. Personal electronic devices (phones etc...with Earphones ONLY) Devices must be silenced during tours and meetings.
6. No important valuables should be brought on the trip (exceptions camera and phones).
7. All students will be in the same attire during campus visits each day. Attire will be indicated each day of the trip on the Daily Itinerary.
8. Everyone must be at the bus or designated locations on time.
9. No one will leave the group at any time without permission or being accompanied by a chaperone.
10. NO visitation of boys to girls' rooms or girls to boys' rooms at any time for any reason.
11. Each person is expected to be courteous to her/his roommate at all times and fellow travelers.
12. Upon arrival, all room problems must be reported to a chaperone.

Room inspections will be conducted prior to departure of each hotel.
Everyone in the room will pay for damages.

13. An end of day meeting will be conducted each night before curfew.
14. Curfew is indicated on the itinerary, No room service is allowed, bed checks will be conducted, at which time you can no longer leave the room for anything.
15. Students are expected to behave as young ladies and gentlemen representing St. Anthony's HS. Serious infractions will be treated as a school disciplinary matter and will be taken up when school is back in session. If a student needs to be sent home due to behavior, parents must be ready to come and escort the student home.
16. In the event of a medical emergency a parent/guardian should be prepared to meet your child at a designated location.
